# Genesis 15

# Four responses to doubt found in Genesis 15:

1. Understand that God does not condemn those who doubt.

Gen. 15:1-3

Job 42:7b:

“You have not spoken of Me what is right as My servant Job has.”

Romans 11:33:

“Oh the depths of the riches and  
wisdom and knowledge of God!

How unsearchable are His  
judgments and how inscrutable His  
ways.”

2. Receive the personal  
reassurance of God.

Genesis 15:4-5



3. Realize that God staked His own life on the promise of grace.

Genesis 15:7-21



## Jeremiah 34:18-19:

“<sup>18</sup> And the men who transgressed my covenant and did not keep the terms of the covenant that they made before me, I will make them like the calf that they cut in two and passed between its parts—<sup>19</sup> the officials of Judah, the officials of Jerusalem, the eunuchs, the priests, and all the people of the land who passed between the parts of the calf.”

Verse 18:

“On that day the Lord made a covenant with Abraham.”

4. Remember that salvation is by faith alone.

Genesis 15:12:

“As the sun was going down, a deep sleep fell on Abram. And behold, dreadful and great darkness fell upon him.”

Mark 15:33:

“And when the sixth hour had come, there was a darkness over the whole land until the ninth hour.”

Isaiah 53:8:

“He was cut off from the land of the living.”

Genesis 15:6:

“And Abraham believed the Lord and  
He counted it to him as  
righteousness.”

Ephesians 2:8-9:

“For by grace you have been saved through faith. And this is not your own doing; it is the gift of God. Not a result of works so that no one can boast.”
